BIG MOUTH

"If your brother should commit some wrong against you, go and point out his fault, but keep it between the two of you." —Matthew 18:15

If we have been wronged, it's absolutely essential to keep it to ourselves. Only after having talked to the other person are we free to bring someone else into the situation or refer it to the Church. However, many times we sin by telling someone about the problem before we should. Our conversation sometimes even deteriorates into gossip and slander. These sins are major catastrophes even if the other person doesn't know it. After we have ruined the Lord's process of reconciliation through sinful conversation and/or gossip, what do we do?

1. Go to Confession as soon as possible. You must admit you have sinned and receive God's forgiveness.
 2. Pray for the strength not to sin again, and ask the Lord to turn your forgiven sins to the good (Rm 8:28).
 3. Apologize to the person with whom you spoke.
 4. If the person you talked about is aware of your sin, you must apologize and seek forgiveness.
 5. Make reparation. Ask the Lord what He would have you do to repair the damage you've done.
- Proceed with the three steps of reconciliation of Matthew 18:15ff.

REVISED ROMAN MISSAL

PART 6

What are the changes to the Gloria? The *Gloria* is a prayer of joyful praise. The opening line of the *Gloria* is taken from the words sung by the angels over the fields of Bethlehem, announcing to the shepherds the good news of Christ's birth (Lk 2:14). The new translation reads: ***Gloria to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will.*** It is fitting that we sing these words as a reminder that every Mass makes present the mystery of Christmas once again. As God was made manifest to the world in the baby Jesus some 2,000 years ago, so he is made present sacramentally upon our altar at the consecration in every Mass. We prepare ourselves to welcome Jesus by repeating the same words of praise that the angels used to herald Christ's coming in Bethlehem.

The opening line is followed by a litany of praise: ***We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory.*** Each of these phrases serves to heighten our gratitude for having received salvation through Christ. We join our voices to express the joy of Christmas and to thank God for sending his Son to redeem us.

Jesus is referred to in the *Gloria* as ***Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son.*** Various New Testament texts point to Jesus' divine Sonship (Jn 5:17-18; 10:30-38; 2 Cor 1:19; Col 1:13; Heb 1:1-2). These titles echo the mystery in which the Son of God became man. The God of the universe actually took on a human nature! When we address Jesus as the ***Only Begotten Son*** in the *Gloria*, we recognize him not merely as a teacher, messenger, or prophet sent from God. We join St. John and other Scripture writers in praising Jesus as the divine Son, the eternal Word, who was made flesh and dwelt among us and through whom we have everlasting life. HAVE YOU EVER WONDERED "WHAT IS CURSILLO"?

Cursillo means "Short Course". Cursillo is a Catholic movement for men and women to get closer to God. It is a three night, three day week-end that starts on Thursday night around 6 p.m. and ends on Sunday night around 8 p.m. The Cursillo is for those who are far from the knowledge that God loves them, for those who are busy, work hard, come home tired, who can't find answers. This is a way that Christ can become the center of their lives.

Cursillo is meant to be a way to ask individuals to make a decision for Christ in solitude. Mixed Cursillos may distract, therefore the men and women week-ends are separate. It is to be an encounter with self that requires separation from ordinary life, especially for those who do not have the luxury in their daily lives to spend needed time alone with God.

Cursillo describes what is fundamental for being Christian, which is "God loves you." We need to hear that in order to be loved, so that in being loved we can in turn love others. If we say this only to the leaders of an environment it is for efficiency sake, as leaders can make the process go quicker. Ultimately all could make a Cursillo. All need to hear that God loves them. God's grace finds expression in Cursillo; optimism, joy, courage, and constancy. It is Christ-centered logic, faith in the Resurrection, recognizing that life is beautiful, important, and worth living.

You do need a sponsor to sign up for a week-end (this is anyone that has made a Cursillo week-end). They are held at the Sarto Retreat House, by the Catholic Center. The cost is \$125.00. This is for a private room w/bath and plenty of FOOD and getting closer to God. *Priceless* The Fall dates are:
