REVISED ROMAN MISSAL PART 5

What is the new translation of the Confiteor?

In the prayer known as the *Confiteor* (which begins, “I confess to Almighty God...”), the new translation better reflects the Latin text of the Mass and helps us cultivate a more humble, sorrowful attitude toward God as we confess our sins. Instead of simply saying that I have sinned “*through my own fault*,” as we have in the old translation, we will now repeat it three times while striking our breasts in a sign of repentance, saying: “*Through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault.*”

This repetition more fully expresses our sorrow over sin. When we are at fault over something small, we might simply say to the person whom we have wronged, “I’m sorry.” But if it is a more serious matter and we *deeply* feel sorrow over our actions, we sometimes apologize several times and in varying ways: “I’m so sorry...I really regret doing that...Please forgive me.” This prayer in the liturgy helps us recognize that sinning against God is no light matter. We must take responsibility for whatever wrong we have done and whatever good we failed to do. At Mass, one does not simply offer an apology to God. The revised translation of this prayer helps the Christian express even more heartfelt contrition and humbly admit that one has sinned “*through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault.*” (Next week: *Changes in the Gloria*)

Super Dupped

"You duped me, O Lord, and I let myself be duped." —Jeremiah 20:7

God doesn't really dupe us. It just seems that way because we think not as God does, but as men do. Instead of duping us, the Lord has higher purposes.

- He surprises us because He knows if He told us in advance, we couldn't bear it .
- He tests us so we might grow and bear fruit . But along with the test, He strengthens and rescues us
- He calls us to serve Him, often before we're ready. God considers it "formation"; we consider it "being duped"
- We're in a spiritual desert, and naturally consider it a dry period. Meanwhile, He woos us with desert love . No, God doesn't deceive us. Jesus tells us right up front that if we are to be His disciple, we must deny our very self, take up our cross each and every day, and follow the same path to Calvary as He did. He doesn't even promise us a bed! Yet Jesus promises us life to the full and His very own joy . The one who does the duping is Satan, with all his lies and empty promises. God's callings are accompanied by the best promises, those that always

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS ABOUT THE ORDINATION OF BISHOP THOMPSON

Q: Who were the ladies in the black capes/veils in the procession?

A: These were the Ladies (and Knights) of the Holy Sepulchre. The Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem can trace its origins back to the Crusades, and today they are especially tasked by the Vatican to support the Christian presence in the Holy Land. Q: What was the significance of holding the *Book of the Gospels* over the head of the Bishop-elect during the Ordination prayer?

A: The act of holding the Gospels over the head of the Bishop during the Ordination is one of the most ancient parts of the ritual itself, being only preceded by the laying on of hands. We have documented evidence from at least the 4th century of this being a part of the ordination rite (see Apostolic Constitutions – <http://www.ccel.org/ccel/schaff/anf07.ix.ix.ii.html>).

The *Book of Gospels* stands as a visible sign of the power and presence of the Holy Spirit in the Ordination. In addition, “the placing of the *Book of Gospels* over the head of the Bishop-elect during the Prayer of Ordination as well as the presentation of it to him illustrate that the faithful preaching of the word of God is the pre-eminent obligation of the office of the Bishop” (Rites of Ordination, Ordination of a Bishop, 26).

This symbolism of the *Book of Gospels* was also emphasized after the Gospel reading when Archbishop Kurtz blessed the people with the *Book of the Gospels*, reminding all of Christ’s presence in the word and our own call to spread the Gospel message.

Q: Where did the diocese get enough vestments for all the priests and bishops in attendance?

A: There were two different sets of vestments used for the Ordination. The red and gold set worn by the Bishop-elect, principal ordaining Bishop, and others in the sanctuary were commissioned especially for the Ordination.

The white chasubles worn by the rest of the bishops and priests were on loan from the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C. The Basilica has 400 white chasubles, and they will loan out these vestments to dioceses around the country for events such as the Ordination.

HAVE YOU EVER WONDERED “WHAT IS CURSILLO”?

Cursillo means “Short Course”. Cursillo is a Catholic movement for men and women to get closer to God. It is a three night, three day week-end that starts on Thursday night around 6 p.m. and ends on Sunday night around 8 p.m.. The Cursillo is for those who are far from the knowledge that God loves them, for those who are busy, work hard, come home tired, who can't find answers. This is a way that Christ can become the center of their lives.

Cursillo is meant to be a way to ask individuals to make a decision for Christ in solitude. Mixed Cursillos may distract, therefore the men and women week-ends are separate. It is to be an encounter with self that requires separation from ordinary life, especially for those who do not have the luxury in their daily lives to spend needed time alone with God.

Cursillo describes what is fundamental for being Christian, which is "God loves you." We need to hear that in order to be loved, so that in being loved we can in turn love others. If we say this only to the leaders of an environment it is for efficiency sake, as leaders can make the process go quicker. Ultimately all could make a Cursillo. All need to hear that God loves them. God's grace finds expression in Cursillo; optimism, joy, courage, and constancy. It is Christ-centered logic, faith in the Resurrection, recognizing that life is beautiful, important, and worth living.

You do need a sponsor to sign up for a week-end (this is anyone that has made a Cursillo week-end). They are held at the Sarto Retreat House, by the Catholic Center. The cost is \$125.00. This is for a private room w/bath and plenty of FOOD and getting closer to God. *Priceless* The Fall dates are:

Women’s week-end ~ November 3 - 6, 2011
