Last fall the Diocese of Evansville began a Strategic Planning process with the two-fold goal of re-energizing parish life throughout the diocese and establishing a future direction for the diocese over the next five years. The data gathering part of this process has been completed. Members of the planning and discernment teams conducted over 100 individual interviews, 46 parish focus groups, 4 town hall meetings, and 3 priest forums. In addition, 333 parishioners throughout the diocese responded to the online questionnaire. Thank you to all who participated in this data-gathering effort.

Now, we begin the process of analyzing the data. Strategic Issues are being identified. Initiatives, efforts and projects to address the strategic issues will be developed. In the end, roadblocks to re-energizing our parishes will be removed and the Catholic Church in southern Indiana will be renewed and recharged.

MASS INTENTIONS – HUH???

Did you know there are several reasons why an individual may ask a priest to offer a Mass? The most common reason to have a Mass offered is, of course, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died; however, did you know that you can request a Mass in thanksgiving for blessings received or for the intentions of another person, such as on their birthday? When a priest offers Holy Mass, he has three intentions: 1) to offer the Mass reverently and validly in accord with the norms of the Church; 2) to offer the Mass in *union with the whole Church and for the good of the whole Church*; and 3) to offer the Mass for a particular intention, such as the repose of the soul of someone who has died. Although this practice dates back to the early Church, we clearly recognize its importance today. When we face the death of someone we know and love, even a person who is not Catholic, to have a Mass offered for the repose of his/her soul and to offer our prayers, in union with the prayers of the whole Church, is more beneficial and comforting than any sympathy card or bouquet of flowers. To have a Mass offered on the occasion of a birthday, anniversary or special need is also appropriate, beneficial and appreciated. So, I invite you to offer a Mass for someone you have loved that has gone before you or perhaps for that couple you know who is celebrating 50 years of marriage. To offer a Mass, please call the parish office.
