### FAMILY FAITH ON THE GO

Last week we looked at some quick and easy ways to introduce your family to the Catholic tradition of morning prayer. This week we offer suggestions for prayer in the evening.

#### Evening Prayers

- Before dinner, it's important to thank God for your food. You might want to add to this prayer an opportunity for each member of the family to thank God for something good that has happened that day.

- Before bed is a good time to help children reflect on the day. Teach them to tell God that they are sorry for things they may have said or done to hurt someone else. Encourage them to pray for people who have hurt them. Bedtime is also a good time to encourage children to pray for family members and friends. A traditional childhood evening prayer goes like this: "God, our Father, I come to say, 'Thank you for your love today!'"

- When you tuck your children into bed, bless them with holy water. Dip your thumb into holy water and trace a cross on their foreheads with the words, "God bless you, and hold you, and keep you from harm." There is always a supply of holy water at the chapel entrance of the church. Just bring your own plastic bottle.

Kids love family rituals. Prayer rituals are powerful because they help kids develop a closer relationship with you and with God. They also create a spiritual foundation for your children that will last — not only through the summer — but throughout their entire lives.

#### MULTIPLICATION TABLE

**"How can I set this before a hundred men?" —2 Kings 4:43**

Many times what we have to offer seems so inadequate. We may only have a couple free hours a week. So how can we renew the Church? We may be confined to home. Our main contact with people is by phone. Under these circumstances, how can we make disciples of all nations? (Mt 28:19) We have five dollars to give, but the church needs \$100,000 to shelter the homeless. What good is five dollars?

We often find ourselves in the same situation as Jesus when He found Himself with five loaves, two fish, and fifteen to twenty thousand people to feed. Perhaps we don't need food multiplied as much as time, energy, and money multiplied. We need Jesus' multiplication miracle daily to change our inadequacy into His sufficiency. Jesus works this miracle daily in the Mass. Because of this, the early Church called the Mass "breaking of the bread." When Jesus breaks bread, our little lives are multiplied to transform the world. *Reflection from Presentation Ministries*

The mission trip that my mother and I participated in was simply a highlight of our summer, and probably something we shall both remember for years to come. It was strangely both what we had expected and not. While visiting this poverty stricken area, my mother and I were astounded at how spotted this was. Another surprise was how our community was somewhat similar to theirs. As we arrived, we learned just how much of their lives revolved around the coal mining industry. This was their home, and it seemed that they would live in no other place. I would like to say in closing that my mother and I felt a sense of spiritual fulfilling while helping out that week. We met some of the most simple and kindhearted people that I feel I will ever encounter. We cannot wait to attend next years' trip, and hope that it will be just as much hard work and just as wonderful as the trip of this summer.
