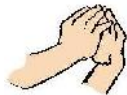

It's hard to believe that Monday is the first day of August! I can remember when June, July and August were the months of summer vacation. ### DAILY BREAD

*"Heed me, and you shall eat well, you shall delight in rich fare." —Isaiah 55:2*

Isaiah prophesied "rich fare." The psalmist promised "the best of wheat". Wisdom invited all to her banquet. "Come, eat of my food, and drink of the wine I have mixed!" Throughout the Old Testament, we were invited to a wondrous banquet. For centuries the chosen people waited for the fulfillment of these prophecies. Finally, they were fulfilled in the Messiah, Jesus. He took the five loaves and two fish and miraculously multiplied them to feed possibly 15-20,000 people. Yet even this did not totally fulfill the Old Testament prophecies. Jesus saved the best till last. At the last supper before He died, Jesus took bread, blessed it, and broke it, saying: "This is My Body". Jesus taught that His flesh was real food and His blood real drink. He was fulfilling the Old Testament prophecies in a way unimaginable. He gave Himself to us in an intimate communion of love.

### Reflection from Presentation Ministries

#### *Summary from June 2011 Parish Council Meeting*

**Parish Council Election:** We welcomed Ruth Ann Hurt and Charles Hamilton to the council. Gina Dupps was reelected.

**Computer Update:** The computer was scheduled to be installed on June 13.

**Electrical Update:** Duke's part of the outside work is complete. More time is needed to complete panels, receptacles, and switches. A decision must be made on 3 ranges (2 electric/1 gas or 1 electric/2 gas) to avoid any issues with the fire marshal. Exterior lights in the front of the church need to be updated, and the directional light in the back of the church may need to be redirected for the motion light. It was decided to remove the steam table but keep the pans.

**Backpack Program Update:** The council has decided to sponsor five children as a cost of \$200 each from the Outreach to the Poor fund.

**Other:** The council approved a \$75 donation to the Kiwanis 5k run. The dehumidifier is not functioning in the basement. It was decided that the July council meeting was not necessary.

**REVISED ROMAN MISSAL  
PART 1**

*“Do this in memory of me.”* These remarkable words were spoken by Jesus nearly 2000 years ago when he instituted the Eucharist at the Last Supper. The Church fulfills this command of the Lord whenever we celebrate the Mass. In doing so, we **participate** in the supreme mystery of our faith, the memorial of Christ’s passion, death, and resurrection. The way in which the Mass is celebrated has undergone various changes throughout the centuries, but the heart of the liturgy has remained the same. It continues to be a celebration of the banquet of the Lord, in which Catholics come to hear the word of God in the Scriptures and receive the body and blood of Christ in the Eucharist. As we prepare to welcome the revised English translation of the Mass, we can be assured that the Eucharist we celebrate will stand in continuity with that first Eucharist instituted by Christ – and that the new translation is intended to help enhance our worship of God and deepen our **participation** in the sacred mysteries of the liturgy.
