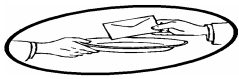

Dear Folks,

We have returned! The mission trip participants have returned from an awesome experience in the Appalachian Mountains of eastern Kentucky. On behalf of our two parishes, we built a deck for an elderly couple whose only way out their back door was down a set of rickety steps nearly 6 feet tall. We dug and measured and laid a new concrete block foundation for a room addition for a family with three children. The youngest is two years old and has a disability that requires him to be indoors much of the time. The new room will allow the family some much needed space. We painted the kitchen, even behind the refrigerator, for a lady who was apprehensive about young people working inside her home, but after only a few hours, our young people won her over and Ethel became our biggest fan.

We learned about the culture of the area and understand better the struggle to balance our need for energy, and the cost to the environment and the people who live near the mines. We visited a golf course complex and a monastery, each built at the top of a mountain. We cooked together, ate together, and prayed together. We felt all of your prayers as well.

When Father Ron sent us off with a blessing on Sunday morning, he said we were going to be Christ's hands and feet. Without a doubt, we were. We also discovered what it means to share with those less fortunate a Christ-like heart. It was just amazing!

BLOOD-COVENANT AND COMMUNION

"This is My blood, the blood of the covenant." —
Mark 14:24

At the Last Supper, Jesus made a covenant with us through His blood. Within the next twenty-four hours, Jesus "poured out" His blood on Calvary (Mk 14:24). This reminds us of the pouring out, even splashing, of the blood of the animal sacrifices on the altar in the Temple (see Lv 17:6). Poured-out blood is a dramatic, sensory expression of total commitment to the Lord.

The writer of Hebrews pictures the blood of the covenant not being splashed but being applied as a cleansing agent. Christ's blood cleanses "our consciences from dead works to worship the living God" (Heb 9:14). Covenant blood is used for the repentance and forgiveness of sins.

Moses made a blood-covenant between the Lord and the Israelites by sprinkling the blood of the animal sacrifices on the people. (Imagine drops of blood falling on your arms, in your face, and in your hair.) This sprinkled blood represented a covenant of obedience, for, before the sprinkling of the blood, the people promised: "All that the Lord has said, we will heed and do" (Ex 24:7, 3).

When we receive Holy Communion, we are covenanting to pour out our lives in total love for the Lord, to repent of our sins, be washed in His blood (see Rv 7:14), and to obey the Lord in every detail of our lives. Make a blood-covenant in Holy Communion today on this feast of Corpus Christi.
